Lauderdale Small Boat Club Coronavirus Prevention/Mitigation Plan

3/11/2020

LSBC recognizes the need to protect their members and the public from the possible transmission of the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). In order to do this, the following practices will be put into place immediately. These practices may change depending on the changes in the Coronavirus, as new information is coming out daily. We need to remain fluid and adapt as needed.

Common areas:

- 1. Full cleaning and disinfecting of all surfaces, doorknobs, bathrooms, tables, chairs, kitchen and pit areas, light switches, remote controls, vending machines, gas pump, and anything else that gets touched by humans. This should be done with disposable gloves that are discarded after each use. If disposable gloves aren't available, reusable gloves can be used, but only for the purpose of the disinfecting for COVID-19. They cannot be used for any other purpose at the club. Every time gloves are removed hands need to be washed with soap for a minimum 20 seconds.
- Signs to be placed around the Pilot House, Clubhouse/Patio and Pit reminding everyone not to touch with bare hands and to use a tissue or napkin. Napkin holders will be placed around and filled so that this is possible.
- 3. Cleaning is with soap and water this will be done at a minimum every day the club is open for an event
- 4. Disinfecting is with an antibacterial cleaner/spray that contains a minimum of 70% alcohol, or a bleach mixture (1/3 c bleach per gallon of water or 4 teaspoons per quart of water). This should be done several times a day on days that the Clubhouse isn't open, and every 15 minutes on days that it is open.

5. Hands should be washed with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds. Alcohol based hand sanitizers can be used to disinfect, but not to clean hands. If hands are dirty, they should be washed before antibacterial sanitizer is applied.

Offices in Pilot House:

 Full cleaning and disinfecting of all desks, keyboards, other office machines, and anything else that is touched. The disinfecting should happen once a day with a disinfecting wipe.

General practice:

- 1. Avoid touching eyes, nose, mouth with unwashed hands
- 2. Wash your hands...
 - a. After blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing
 - b. After using the restroom
 - c. Before eating or preparing food
 - d. After contact with animals or pets
- Any member or guest at the club with an untreated 100.4 degree fever or higher should stay home
- 4. Any member or guest who has travelled abroad or on a cruise in the last 14 days should be <u>requested</u> to stay home
- 5. Avoid kisses, hugs, handshakes as greetings at this time. Bump elbows as a greeting instead, or a wave will do.

Employee Shortage:

 LSBC has system of membership volunteers for required work hours to maintain their membership. Membership can be called upon to fulfill employee shortages.

Suppliers:

- 1. Chaney Brothers, Restaurant Depot, Amazon, and local markets.
- 2. Supply chain issues: LSBC has credit and liquid funding to use open markets for supplies required.
